What **common cultural foundation** to construct Europe in the 21st century?

What kinds of **alliances** to conjure up?



The emergencies that Syrians face, whether they are under fire, destitute, injured, disappeared or refugees, don't even allow them the possibility to reflect on their own situation. Faced with that, I am powerless. But as a writer, my rôle, and my only way is to try to analyse, explain, and enlighten. For the moment, we are in a process of growing extremism, of violence, vengeance and active war. But once a little peace returns and allows us to lift our heads and look around us, once a changed environment, restoring a minimum of justice, is established, each of us will be able to reconsider our behaviour, actions and positions.

The results of the last elections revealed a Europe under full reconstruction. In the name of the nation and sovereignty of the people, Europe has been turned upside down with progressive conquests by national populists of projects that are confused but seductive for a certain number of us: anti-immigration, climate scepticism, anti-feminism, anti-abortion... and anti-European.

In response, European cultural civil society conceives innovative forms of solidarity action, bringing together approaches that are artistic, technical and activist. It is interrogating hospitality and the colonial past in Palermo, the reappropriation of war narratives by the Syrian diaspora in Berlin and Istanbul, an affirmation of reconciliation in Nicosia... It is setting to work on a renewed dialogue of participation, of shared justice, negotiated common interest and affirmed interdependence.

This reversal of perspectives that reflects the primary concept of a within against an outside, seems to be able to open a path to a more just European project, open to the world and its diversity. It activates a new European cultural agenda based on a civil society that is inventive. How then do we learn to build together and in a different way, as active citizens, this new "commons"?

On Wednesday 4th and Thursday 5th September, resuming the path begun last year, we will consider in a more forward-looking way four European cultural commons around which to "make alliances": Acting in solidarity, Acting in rights, Assembling diversity, Community building.

During these two days of **#Conversations**, with our invitees from Europe and beyond, we will explore the challenges, opportunities and difficulties in setting the bases of the new ways of cooperation around these commons. Starting out from elsewhere. Develop in the way we represent the world. Learn to work with unusual partners, even with "adversaries". These "(un)easy alliance" are one of the conditions of being at the centre of this European reconstruction.

(un)easy alliances – **Acting in solidarity**

Solidarity is the essential cultural commons for a just European society. How to face up to emergencies and create the conditions of a European culture of solidarity? How, starting from our artistic and cultural practice, to build public spaces, habitats, systems of exchange, networks of increased solidarity? How to make alliances and cooperate, in Europe, in the Mediterranean and beyond, so that each of us can play a part in the reconstruction that is under way?

(un)easy alliances – **Acting in right**

Acting in right is the cultural commons of a European society founded on equal sovereignty for all, when what might seem to be assured or guaranteed is not so, no longer so, less and less, and not for all. Starting with our artistic and cultural practice, how can we engender a culture of the right of all? How can we reconsider all of our cultural actions (designate, represent, say, speak...) as a practical act of right? How can we make alliances and cooperate, in Europe and beyond, around a right, in which we all share authorship?

(un)easy alliances – **Assembling diversity**

Gathering together diversity is a cultural commons of an open and living European society that is being constructed through permanent interaction, interdependence and friction? How can we gather together our uniqueness, living beings, technology places, practices...? How to do this without fear, among individuals, societies in the North, the South, the East, the West, that have long been separated? How to make alliances and cooperate, in Europe and beyond, for a new culture of coexistence?

(un)easy alliances – **Community building**

Community building is the cultural commons of a European society, searching for a way to define and peacefully construct a new project while everything is becoming tight and frozen. How to create the conditions for a culture of thinking and doing together? Starting with our artistic and cultural practice, how to conceive of places and forms of relationship that convey open democracy? How to reappropriate the fundamentals, deliberate, judge, negotiate? How to make alliances and cooperate, in Europe and beyond, for a culture of “organised pluralism”?



Information cells on European tools

Throughout the year, Relais Culture Europe offers to all many tools with which to inform, direct, strengthen and develop new projects (Information seminars, on line seminars, incubators, regional LabEurope, Learning Lab...).

During these morning sessions, the team of Creative Europe France will discuss perspectives and changes in the Creative Europe programme (Culture and MEDIA), and in the European Union's programmes for education (Erasmus+ - in presence of Laure Coudret-Laut, director of the French National Agency Erasmus+) and research (Horizon 2020)

(un)easy alliances - **Acting in solidarity** - Tell. Circulate

The wars in Syria, then that in Lybia, their images, their narratives, that are present and always one-sided, have led to a painful reconstruction of the civil sector. How to circulate images and narratives and an ethical practice that concerns us all? How to give presence to what is happening and said elsewhere?

(un)easy alliances - **Acting in right** - Making visible

Designating, representing, saying what is real is the basis for just action. Artists and cultural activists try to make visible all the juxtaposed levels of reality: what is fragile and could disappear; what reveals latent conflicts: what is important and hidden. How to build from this the possible basis for collective practice?

(un)easy alliances - **Assembling diversity** - East / West: resuming the dialogue

The dialogue between Eastern and Western Europe seems difficult today. Misunderstanding of the realities, lack of understanding of real life experiences, ignorance of separate or forgotten memory, segmented civil networks... How to create a new culture of confidence?

(un)easy alliances - **Community building** - Place-making

Community-building is about being able to dialogue between place and place, and between located culture and located culture, in all their diversity. How to create spaces of enunciation, translation and negotiation between different forms of representation? How to place-make today?

Speaking, judging, choosing

Community-building is about being able to ensure its collective rights but also those of its cultural peculiarities or those that are more broadly human. Artists and cultural activists are interrogating the numerous breaches of rights in society today. How to reappropriate the fundamentals, deliberate, judge, negotiate...
